Why do we vote? Do we see it as symbol of our freedom to choose our elected officials? Do we see it as a responsibility of being an engaged citizen? Candidate Pledge:

As a candidate for election to the Legislative Assembly of Ontario, I commit to support publicly funded and publicly delivered education based on the following principles:

- Access to the highest quality publicly funded, publicly delivered education system for all children.
- Access to all necessary resources to allow children to attend school and succeed, inclusive of all their specific educational needs.
- A guarantee that all school facilities are maintained to the highest standards of repair and cleanliness.
- The right to safe and healthy schools.
- A guarantee that all students have access to schools within a reasonable commute from their home.
- Access to fully resourced, properly staffed library facilities in every school.
- The right to small class sizes so that parents can be assured their children will have adequate access to education supports in class.
- A comprehensive curriculum that guarantees that students have access to a diversity of learning
 experiences and have access to the classes they need in order to succeed in the kinds of work
 they choose.
- The right to safe and accepting schools.

If elected, I commit to championing public policy reform in support of the above principles. My advocacy will include the following measures, which offer the only long-term assurance of high-quality services in Ontario's publicly funded education system:

- To improve the working and learning environment of everyone in schools: increase staffing levels
 of all education worker positions in schools.
- To make up for a decade of real wage cuts due to legislated wage freezes and wage restraint: an end to the attack on education workers' wages and improving compensation.
- To ensure that staffing levels are maintained and service levels can be improved: increase funding to school boards.

Do you believe that the public education system is adequately funded?

No. The system is chronically underfunded, particularly in the area of Special Education. We require thousands more Special Needs Assistants, Educational Assistants and support workers to maintain our schools.

Do you believe that the current system and access to resources allow children to attend school and succeed?

Do you believe it is Inclusive of all their specific educational needs?

The current system could be enhanced in many ways. Additional support staff to help students integrate into the regular program is essential. We have so many students with high needs and not enough support staff to meet the need.

Do you believe that current funding addresses the need that all school facilities are maintained to the highest standards of repair and cleanliness?

Our schools have been neglected for many years by successive provincial governments. We need millions of dollars to address the backlog of school repairs. In addition, in order to provide world-class facilities for our students, additional investments need to be made to ensure that our learning spaces are inviting, dynamic and arrangement to facilitate student collaboration.

Where do you stand on class sizes and the diversity of learning experiences?

Class sizes need to be reduced at the Junior/ Intermediate and Senior Levels. Students thrive in smaller group settings where teachers are able to get to know their students and promote a sense of family.

Do you believe that the public education system is adequately funded?

No; New Democrats will review and repair the education funding formula to ensure funding meets the needs of Ontario's students today, and into the future. And we will increase special education funding.

Do you believe that the current system and access to resources allow children to attend school and succeed?

Do you believe it is Inclusive of all their specific educational needs?

An NDP government will ensure that targeted supports are provided where they are needed most. We will overhaul the existing education funding formula with a comprehensive review to be completed within one year. A new funding formula will ensure that students are equitably supported, and learning gaps are closed.

Do you believe that current funding addresses the need that all school facilities are maintained to the highest standards of repair and cleanliness?

No; New Democrats are committed to clearing the \$16.8 billion school repair backlog within

ten years. We will hire more custodians and maintenance staff and establish a province-wide standard for cleaning and school repairs. As part of our Green New Democratic Deal, we will work to upgrade all public school buildings to make them carbon neutral and climate resilient, ensuring they meet both current and future needs. We'll apply those same principles to new school buildings, ensuring they meet international energy efficiency standards.

Where do you stand on class sizes and the diversity of learning experiences?

An NDP government will cap kindergarten class sizes at 26 and maintain the Teacher-ECE team, cap grades 4-8 classes at 24, and lower high school class sizes so that students can receive more attention from teachers.

Do you or your party support wage restraint or wage freeze legislation eg. Bill 124? Please explain why.

Absolutely not. New Democrats are committed to a new relationship with teachers and education workers, one built on a foundation of respect and a shared commitment to a stronger public education system. We'll invite all sector stakeholders to a new education partnership table as we work to overhaul the funding formula to reflect the needs of students today. We'll bargain in good faith, and support school boards to negotiate agreements that create working and learning conditions that will help our next generation succeed.

Would you support wage restraint or wage freeze legislation moving forward?

No. New Democrats are committed to bargaining in good faith.

Do you support Return to Work Legislation?

No. New Democrats have continuously pushed back against previous governments who have tried to pass Return to Work Legislation.

We'll restore respect and fair compensation for the people who deliver education.


No, educators are overwhelmed and deserve to be Supported and compensated accordingly.



Do you believe that the public education system is adequately funded?

Not at all and it has not been, for some time. As a point of fact, just prior to the pandemic, the Ford government targeted our schools and teachers, planning to fire 10,000 teachers, increase class sizes and move more classes to online learning. The previous Liberal government had begun to invest more heavily in education before the election in 2018. Since that time funding has been drastically reduced for education at a time where we needed even more investment to get our children safely (both physically and mentally) through this health care crisis.


Do you believe that the current system and access to resources allow children to attend school and succeed?

Do you believe it is Inclusive of all their specific educational needs?

No to both questions. The Liberal government will invest in our students. Where the Conservatives cut 1.3 Billion from Education in the last budget, Ontario Liberals will be funding new technology and devices in classrooms. We will be reducing class sizes and hiring 10,000 new teachers in order to do that. Many students have been affected by the ramifications of Covid 19 on learning, and so we are bringing back a choice for Grade 13, for students to take an extra year to reach their full education potential. Finally, we will eliminate the mandatory e-learning that poses a challenge for so many students, but also create high-quality online options for high school students. The Ontario Liberals will hire 5,000 more special education workers in order to reduce wait time for services and close learning gaps, including additional support for students with autism and reading disabilities.

Do you believe that current funding addresses the need that all school facilities are maintained to the highest standards of repair and cleanliness?

No. Many schools are in poor repair. In order to keep staff and children safe, ventilations systems MUST be upgraded. There are older schools throughout this riding that do not meet today's standards for accessibility. Many were due to be leveled and new schools built under the previous Liberal government. That did not happen when the Conservatives came to power. The Liberals plan to invest 10 BILLION in education much of which will go to build 200 new schools and to repair, upgrade and rebuild 4,500 others.

Where do you stand on class sizes and the diversity of learning experiences?

While the Ford Conservatives try to cut education funding and raise class sizes, we'll cap class sizes at 20 students in every grade across the province – starting first with schools where this would have the biggest impact.

Do you or your party support wage restraint or wage freeze legislation eg. Bill 124? Please explain why.

Ontario Liberal Leader, Steven Del Duca has repeated called for the repeal of Bill 124. This type of bill caps increases below the rate of inflation, leaving the employee earning less each year. It leads to career dissatisfaction, employee shortages and burnout. It is an affront to the collective bargaining process.


Would you support wage restraint or wage freeze legislation moving forward? No.



Do you believe that Education Worker staffing levels are currently meeting the demands of our system?

No. The Ontario Liberals have a plan to hire 10,000 more teachers so students can catch up on learning lost during the pandemic. They need their teachers focus and attention more than ever, so they can not just teach, but reach them. To meet our target, we will recruit teachers from other provinces, - including those whose religious freedoms are being threatened by Quebec's Bill 21. We will help qualified teachers immigrate to Ontario and attract some of the 80,000 Ontario certified teachers not currently employed by schools back to the teaching profession.

Is there anything else that we should know about you that may be of interest to Education Workers?

Over these past two years, it was hard to keep learning. Our kids struggled with opening and closing classes, teachers felt disconnected with remote learning and parents were overwhelmed. Our province and our kids deserve the best education in the world, not chaos and disruption. A good education is the best tool we have to help people find success and build a stronger, more prosperous Ontario – and that's true at any age. We don't want learning to end after high school, so we'll make it easier than ever to find, afford and benefit from higher education and training – helping people learn skills that will get them hired into good, well-paying careers. Our Ontario Liberal plan supports our students and gets everyone ready for a career – be it that first great job or the next big opportunity.


Do you or your party support wage restraint or wage freeze legislation eg. Bill 124? Please explain why.


No I do not believe that current education worker compensation matched the impact Education Workers have on the success of the system. These workers deserve more for the hard work that they do.
